Dear colleague,

As of 1st June you will be able to request non-urgent additional biochemistry tests for any samples stored at the RIE using a designated email service instead of phoning the laboratory. This e-mail service will initially be provided on a trial basis and the ongoing provision of this will be reviewed after 6 months.

Biochemistry samples stored at the RIE can be identified by their lab number and will all start HB. Please note biochemistry samples are routinely stored for up to 5 days and it is unlikely that they will be available after this time. Not all tests are stable for up to 5 days and sometimes we may not be able to process an add on request for this reason. Haematology samples are usually only stored at RIE for 24 hours and it is therefore rarely possible to add on requests to haematology samples.
